2019 American Architecture Award

from The Chicago Athenaeum Museum of Architecture and Design and The European Centre for Architecture Art Design and Urban Studies



Portland, Oregon (August 23, 2019) - The Sherman and Joyce Bowie Scott Hall at Carnegie Mellon University was among the 106 buildings chosen nationwide to receive the prestigious 2019 American Architecture Awards for the best new architecture designed and constructed by American architects and by international architects with offices in the United States. OFFICE 52 Architecture was the Design Architect for Scott Hall, a commission won in a national design competition. Scott Hall is the College of Engineering's new LEED-Gold 109,000 square foot Nanoscience, Bioscience and Energy Technologies Building at Carnegie Mellon University.

The 2019 American Architecture Awards will be presented at a gala reception in Miami and are organized by The Chicago Athenaeum: Museum of Architecture and Design and The European Centre for Architecture Art Design and Urban Studies—jointly presenting this annual, prestigious program for Design Excellence and for the best innovative contemporary American architecture. It's the nation's highest public award given by a non-commercial, non-trade affiliated, public arts, culture, and educational institution. "For 25 years, The American Architecture Awards have presented stunning and meticulously-designed projects," states Christian Narkiewicz-Laine, Museum President, The Chicago Athenaeum.
